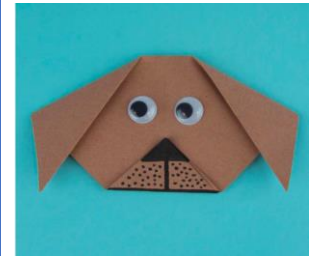
- Look/walk outside to observe the weather today.
